DEC (Drug Endangered Children) Academy 101: Developing Foundational Knowledge

The National Alliance for Drug Endangered Children built this Academy to provide the foundational knowledge around drug endangered children.

The Academy sessions include:

1) Orientation—2 hours

2) DEC Awareness—2 hours

The DEC Awareness Training helps participants gain awareness about drug endangered children, the risks they face and the long-term impacts; understand the many opportunities to identify children at risk; learn the importance of early identification and intervention to change the trajectories of the lives of drug endangered children and break multigenerational cycles.

3) DEC Approach—2 hours

This training focuses on how to implement the DEC Approach, which is a strategy based on a common vision, ongoing collaboration between various disciplines and agencies, and ongoing changes in practice. The DEC Approach is effective in improving the likelihood of better outcomes for drug endangered children.

4) Marijuana: The Danger Remains —2 hours

This session, led by one of National DEC's subject matter experts, outlines the risks children face whether marijuana is legal or not. The trainer will discuss the risks to children growing up in households where marijuana and marijuana products are consumed, grown, processed, and sold.

5) Intersection of DEC and Human Trafficking —2 hours

During this introductory training, participants will learn and understand the connections between drug and endangered children and human trafficking which are often overlooked by many disciplines. Definitions, statistics and case examples will be shared to help participants recognize the vulnerabilities, understand the intersections, and what can be done to identify and intervene.

6) **DEC Coaching Session**—2 hours

The Coaching session will be targeted and may be focused on questions, overcoming barriers and next steps to take in DEC efforts.
