
Why We Care

Drug endangered children are children whose lives, health and safety are jeopardized by drug manufacture, drug dealing or drug abuse in a family home. This harm can include physical, emotional and sexual abuse and/or neglect, including failure to nurture, supervise or provide meals, sanitary and safe living conditions, schooling and medical care.

The primary challenge with substance abuse and drug endangered children is in coordinating the social and political systems charged with preventing, intervening and treating these cases. The complexities of these cases challenge practitioners and the community. There is often a lack of appropriate and accessible treatment intervention and prevention programs. The various disciplines have different roles, responsibilities and perspectives.
